Fukumitsu Museum
Displays works of artists who have a connection with Fukumitsu including the wood-block artist Munakata Shiko and the sculptor and potter Matsumura Hidetaro.

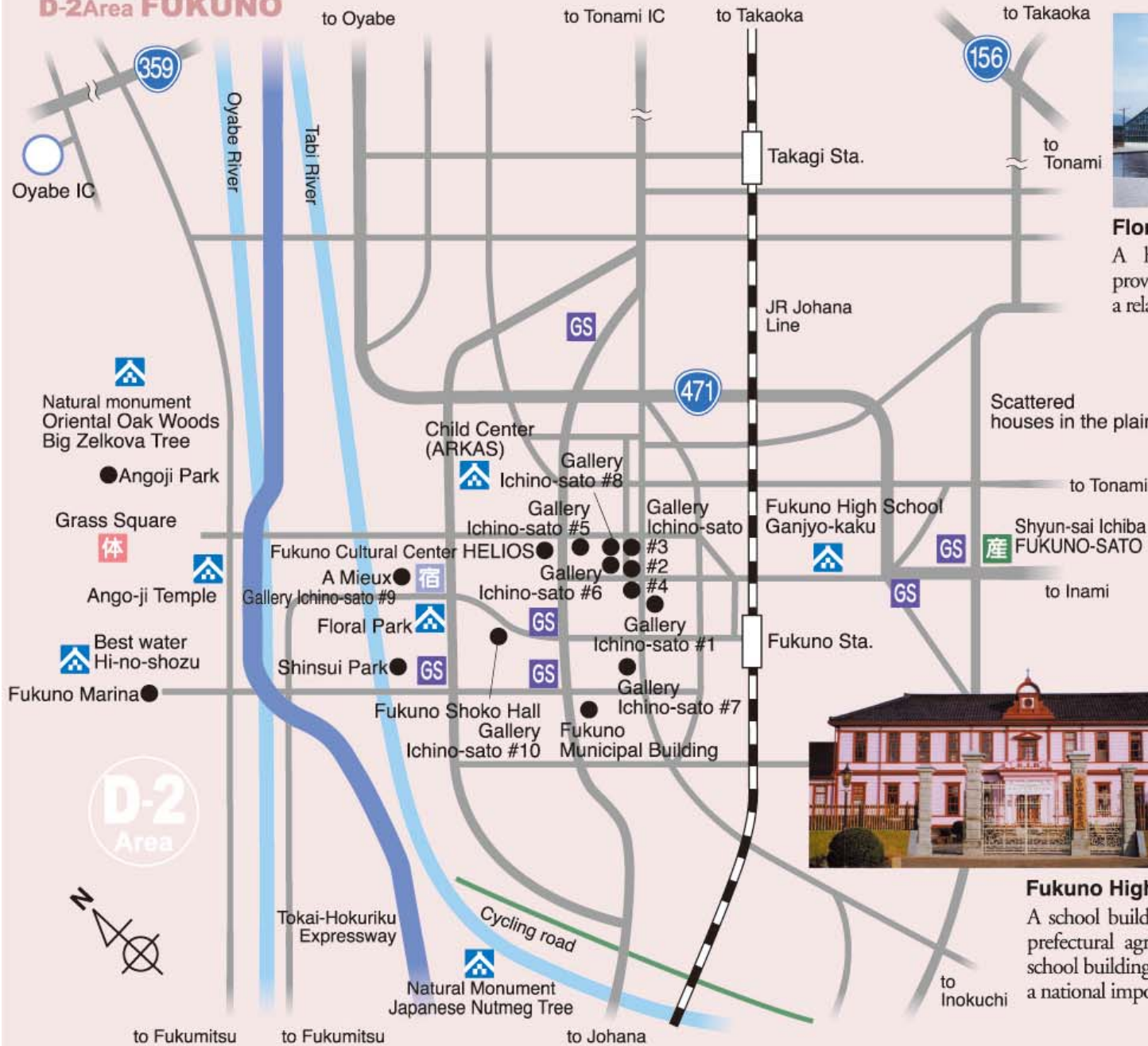
Riugasai

Floral Park

A horticultural botanical garden that provides botanical cultural information and a relaxing spot with flowers and greenery.



Ango-ji Temple

Constructed in the Nara Era at the Emperor Shomu's behest. Many cultural assets including the statue of the goddess of mercy, which is designated as a national important cultural asset, are preserved.



Fukuno High School Ganryo-kaku

A school building that was constructed in 1903 as a prefectural agricultural school. It shows features of school buildings of the Meiji Era and was designated as a national important cultural property in 1997.
